



Summary

Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS) is an innovative teaching strategy to encourage student development of critical thinking, observation/communication skills, & tolerance for ambiguity. This poster shares the results of an interprofessional VTS session including nursing, radiologic technology, and pharmacy students.

Poster Objectives

1. Summarize the process of facilitating Visual Thinking Strategies.
2. Analyze a pilot interprofessional education VTS session.
3. Reflect on VTS as an interprofessional education activity.

IPE Session Objectives

1. Appraise art as part of an interprofessional group
2. Defend statements with observations
3. Value the input from others

Methods

1. What's going on in this picture?
2. What do you see that makes you say that?
3. What more can we find?

Facilitator:

Listens, points, paraphrases, links common and disparate comments, remains neutral, encourages all voices

- 3-hour VTS session, $n = 19$
- Pre/post-self-assessments
- Budner's Tolerance for Ambiguity Scale (TAS)
- Communication Skills Attitude Scale (CSAS)



Results & Recommendations

- TAS and CSAS Wilcoxon Signed Rank Tests: results not statistically significant
- Excellent student feedback:
"As the proctor would redirect and refocus our view of the artwork we as a group came closer together with a better understanding of one another's thoughts and viewpoint in a respectful, thoughtful, and meaningful way. Thank you for a great educational and personal growth experience."
- Use VTS in didactic, clinical, and laboratory learning activities.
